

Hills City Council Meeting
October 28, 2024 / 7:00 PM / Hills Community Center

The regular Hills City Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Kemp at 7:00 PM on Monday, October 28, 2024 at the Hills Community Center.

Present: Council Members: Hudachek, Knebel, Rummelhart and Sommers. Absent: Volk.
Also present: Sedlacek, City Admin; Frembgen-Kesner, Deputy Clerk; and Pantel, Fire Chief/Maintenance.

Consent Agenda: Sommers motioned to approve consent agenda (October 15, 2024 minutes, scheduled list of claims and receipts from October 11-October 24) and Rummelhart seconded. Ayes: 4. Motion carried.

Public Comment: None.

Business: Sommers mentioned that he would like to get to 100% funding for the Johnson County Sheriff agreement at some point. Kemp made a comment to council that both on the resolution and on the agreement under the hourly rate portion it will be changed from FY2028/FY2028 to FY2028/FY2029. Knebel motioned to approve Resolution 2024-21 approving 28E agreement with Johnson County Sheriff Department and Sommers seconded. Roll call vote was taken. Ayes: Hudachek, Rummelhart, Knebel, Sommers. Motion carried.

Sommers motioned to move November 11th meeting to November 12th due to the holiday and Rummelhart seconded. Ayes: 4. Motion carried.

Kemp went over the rough draft of the parade ordinance. Sommers would like “not less than 14 days” changed to “not less than 30 days.” Ordinance will be presented at a later to date to council for first reading.

Reports: Attorney: No report.

Mayor: Talked to the ICCSD superintendent about the elementary building and they plan to demo it in November or December. Kemp was contacted by the ICCSD about possibly creating a 28E agreement between the City of Hills and ICCSD.

Maintenance: No report.

Fire Department: Pantel mentioned that they may do an open house day for Fire Prevention month next year. There will be 2 fire trucks out for trick or treating this year.

City Administrator: Sedlacek mentioned that the City of Hills got awarded a grant for the mural that will go on the south side of the fire station. Mural will hopefully be up and completed by the Songbird Sanctuary Park grand opening.

Water: No report.

Sewer: No report.

Council Comments: Knebel brought up the speed sign on east Main St. and Pantel discussed that he was trying to get it to work, no luck so far. Knebel also asked how city wide clean up went. Knebel also mentioned to the council that N. Mellecker stopped her and said how nice his driveway looked. Sommers would like to thank Tiffany Pantel for all her help with the city. Knebel motioned to adjourn the meeting and Sommers seconded. Ayes: 4. Motion carried.
